I am delighted to tell you about an exciting new science project that we are launching in our school. We are calling upon all of our budding Loxdale scientists to complete a project on the theme of 'Journeys'. The idea is to provide our children with the opportunity to develop their 'Working Scientifically' skills whilst completing their projects. To ensure as wide a variety of projects as possible, we have split the theme into different areas:

Year Groups	Project Theme
Reception, Year 1 and Year 2	Journeys Through Nature
Years 3, 4 and 6	Journeys of The Body
Year 5	Journeys On Earth and Beyond

To begin to fuel your imaginations, the project could be a model, an interactive poster, a game, an experiment presentation... the sky's the limit! We would ask that all completed projects are brought into school on Monday 4th March.

On Tuesday 5th March between 2.30pm and 4.00pm, all projects that have been entered will be judged. There will be a winner and a runner-up nominated for each year group. Winning entries will be displayed at an exhibition held at Wolverhampton University on Friday 15th March, where each of the winners will be invited to visit. These children will be treated to a mind-boggling science show and will even take part in a graduation ceremony in the University's Grand Assembly Room! The runners-up from each year group will have their projects proudly displayed in the foyer at the front of school for all of our visitors to see.

We have planned workshops to run throughout the afternoon of Monday 25th February, which, unfortunately will be 'invitation only'. So if your child has been selected for this, you will receive a separate letter, inviting you to this workshop. During this time, you may come into school to work on a science project with your child. A range of resources will be available for use during this time too.

We look forward to seeing some amazing projects and appreciate all of the effort and enthusiasm that goes in at home to support your child with their work.
